

# TIMEX<sup>®</sup> AM/FM Dual Alarm Clock Radio with Digital Tuning

### SET - +

- Press to decrease/increase settings

### TIME SET ⌚

- Press and hold Time Set button to set Clock
- Use +/- to set hour and press Time Set button to confirm
- Use +/- to set minute and press Time Set button to confirm

Note: Use Alarm 1 or Alarm 2 Button to select 12/24 hour display while in time set mode

### ALARMS 1 & 2 🕒 🕒

- Press & Hold Alarm 1 or Alarm 2 button to Set Alarm
- Use +/- to select hour and press Alarm 1 or Alarm 2 button to confirm
- Use +/- to select minute and press Alarm 1 or Alarm 2 button to confirm
- Use +/- to adjust volume and press Alarm 1 or Alarm 2 button to confirm
- Press and release Alarm 1 or Alarm 2 button to select the alarm source Buzzer, Radio and arm/disarm alarm

### ALARM RESET

- When alarm is sounding, press to disarm and reset for next day

### POWER/MODE ⏻

- Press and release to **turn ON** the radio, press again to select the AM or FM
- Use +/- to tune radio to a desired station. Press and hold to seek the next clear station
- Use Volume Down ⏮ button or Volume Up ⏭ Button to adjust radio volume
- Press and hold the Power/Mode button to **turn OFF** the radio

### TIP: Extend FM antenna for best reception.

### PRESET RADIO SETTING AND OPERATION

- This unit will store up to 20 station presets, 10 AM and 10 FM.
- Tune to a station you want to assign to a preset.
- Press and hold the Time/Preset Button to enter presetting mode.
- Use +/- to select the preset number you wish to assign (P01 - P10).
- Press and release the Time/Preset Button to confirm the preset number (P01 - P10) you want to assign to the current station. Continue steps above to set all desired presets.
- To listen to a preset AM or FM station at any time, press and release the Time/Preset Button as needed to select the desired preset station.

### SNOOZE

- Press to Snooze Alarm

### DIMMER ⏴

- Press to Adjust Display Brightness: cycle through Hi, Med, Lo and OFF

### SLEEP 🛌

- Press and release the Sleep Button in AM/FM mode to select the desired sleep interval: 90, 80, 70, 60, 50, 40, 30, 20, 10 minutes or OFF (turns unit off right away).

### Installing the Batteries

- Use a Philips screwdriver to open the battery compartment door.
- Install 2 new "AAA" batteries to maintain settings in case of power failure, matching the (+/-) markings in the battery compartment.
- Close the battery compartment door and tighten the battery door screw. Don't over tighten.

### DISPLAY ICONS

\*Remove protective film in the front of display by peeling it off.



### Maintenance

- Place the unit on a level surface away from sources of direct sunlight or excessive heat.
- Protect your furniture when placing your unit on a natural wood and lacquered finish. A cloth or other protective material should be placed between it and the furniture.

### Battery Cautions and Tips - Keep new and used batteries away from children.

- Caution - Risk of explosion if the battery is replaced by an incorrect type.
- Only use the recommended/supplied batteries or equivalent.
- Use alkaline batteries for longer life.
- Do not mix old and new batteries, and do not mix alkaline, carbon-zinc or rechargeable nickel-cadmium batteries.
- Insert batteries with proper polarity (+/-) as indicated.
