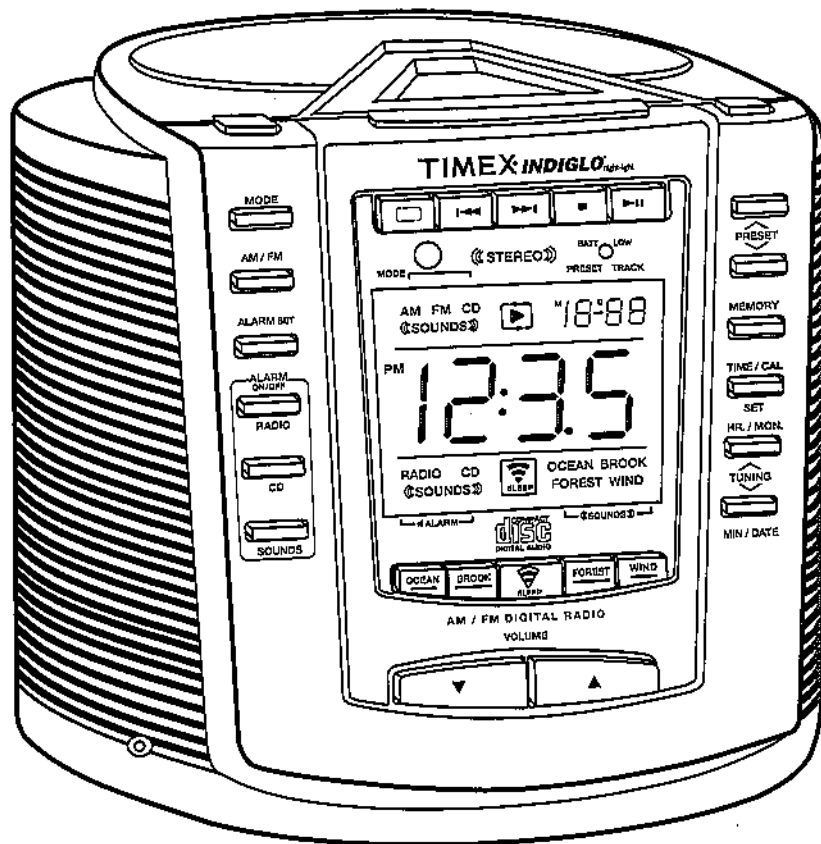

## **A Consumer Guide to Product Safety**

This unit has been designed and manufactured to assure your personal safety. Improper use can result in potential electrical shock or fire hazards. Please read all safety and operating instructions carefully before installation and use. Keep these instructions handy for future reference. Take special note, adhere to all warnings, and always follow the instructions on the unit and in the instruction and service manuals.

1. **Water and Moisture** - The unit should not be used near water. For example: near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, swimming pool or in a wet basement.
2. **Ventilation** - The unit should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation. For example, it should not be situated on a bed, sofa, rug or similar surface that may block ventilation openings. Also, it should not be placed in a built-in installation, such as a bookcase or cabinet that may impede the flow of air through the ventilation openings.
3. **Heat** - The unit should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves or other appliances (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
4. **Power Sources** - The unit should be connected to a power supply only of the type described in the operating instructions or as marked on the appliance.
5. **Grounding or Polarization** - This product is equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). # Preparation for Use

## Preparation for Use

1. Remove the radio and all packing materials from the carton. You should save all packing materials if the unit ever needs to be returned for service. If you do not wish to save the materials, dispose of them properly.
2. Place the unit on a stable, level surface, close to an AC outlet, out of direct sunlight, and away from sources of excess dust, dirt, heat, water, moisture, vibration and strong magnetic fields.
3. Plug AC cord into an outlet.

**NOTE:** If you are going to install batteries for the Battery Backup System, they should always be installed before plugging in the AC cord. (See Battery Backup Installation).

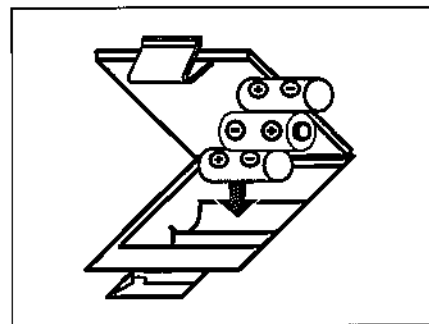
## Maintenance

1. **Protect your furniture when placing the unit on a natural wood and lacquered finish. A cloth or other protective material should be placed between the unit and the furniture.**
2. You may clean your unit with a soft cloth moistened only with mild soap and water. Stronger cleaning agents, such as Benzine or other materials, can mar the surface of the case.

## Battery Backup Installation

1. For the use of the Battery Backup System, turn the unit over and remove the battery compartment door.
2. Install 3 "AA" batteries, while making sure that the + and - ends match up with those inside the battery compartment.
3. Close the battery compartment door, turn the unit over and plug back in the AC cord.

**NOTE:** We recommend using alkaline batteries for the longest life. When the batteries are getting weak a Battery Low LED Indicator will light on the upper right side above the display to let you know that it is time to install new ones.

### **Battery Backup System**

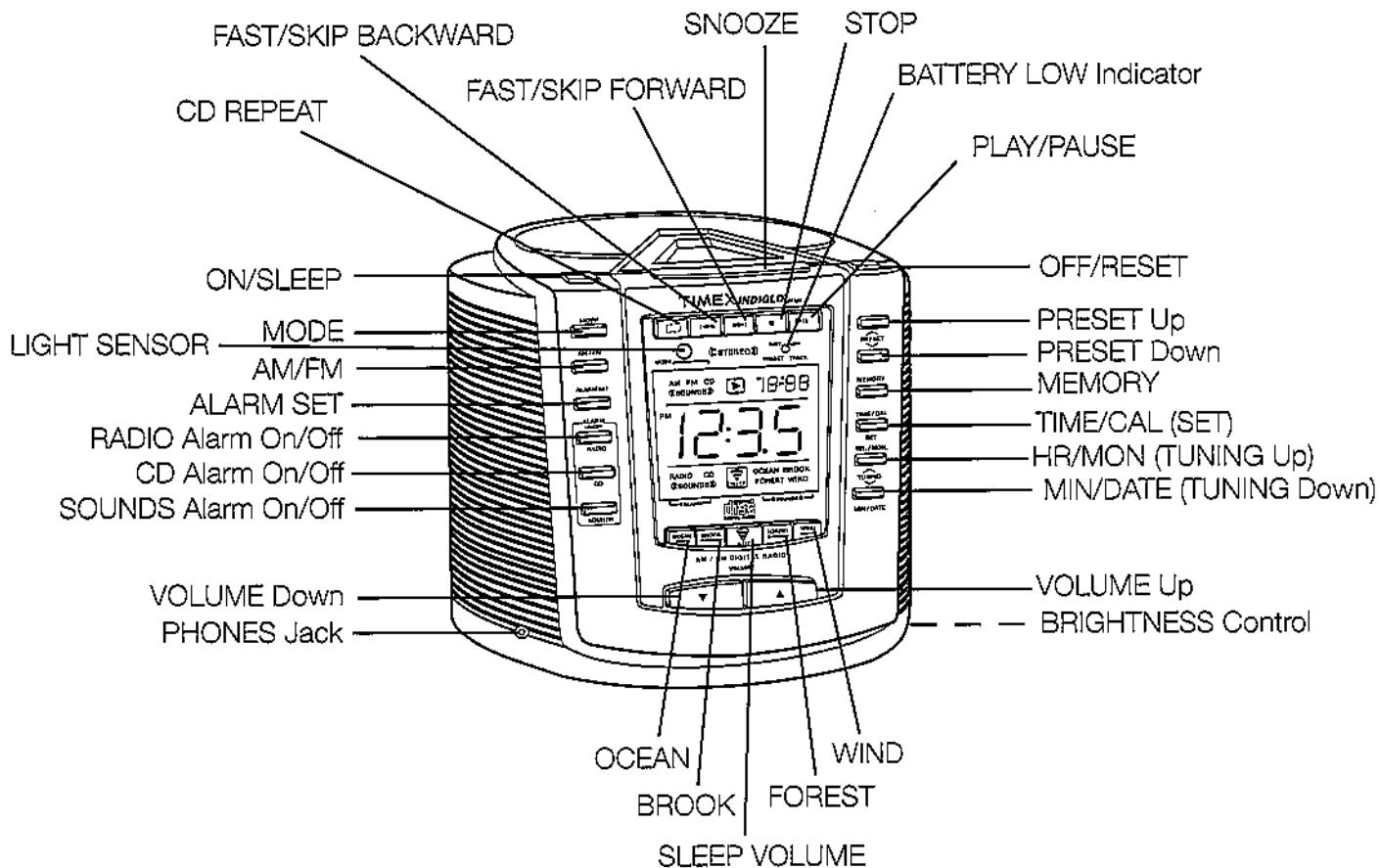
The Battery Backup system will maintain the time, date and alarm in the event of a power failure. If the power goes off the Radio, Nature Sounds, and CD will not play, but the display remains visible and the clock continues to run.

If you have set the alarm for Radio, Nature Sounds or CD and there is a power failure during your wake up time, the Radio, Nature Sounds or CD will default to Buzzer.

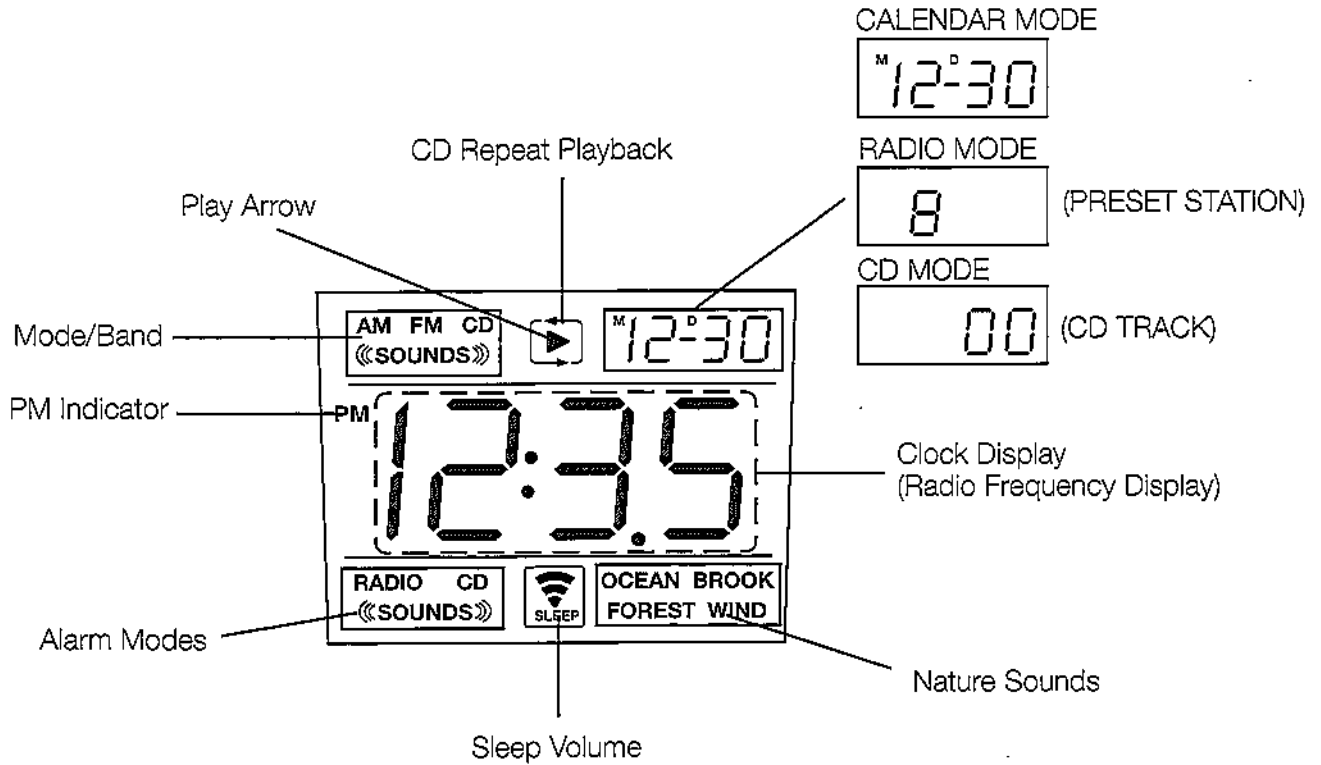
If the alarm has sounded and the Radio, Nature Sounds or CD are playing, then a power failure occurs, once again they will default to Buzzer.

If a power failure occurs and there are no batteries in the battery compartment, all time, alarm and memory settings will be lost. When power is restored the display will read 12:00 and the date will read 1-01.



# Setting the Clock Time and Calendar

## Before you start please note the following:

While setting the Time or Calendar, if you do not press the HR/MON or MIN/DATE Button within 10 seconds, the display will stop flashing. If this happens you must press the TIME/CAL Button **Once** to enter the Setting Mode and **twice** to enter the Calendar Setting Mode.



**PM Indicator**

**Step 1 TIME/CAL**

- Press **once** to enter Setting the Time mode. The clock digits will begin to flash.

**Step 2 HR/MON**

- While the clock digits are flashing, press to set the correct hour. Make sure you set the correct AM and PM. A "PM" indicator will appear in the upper left corner next to the current time display.

**Step 3 MIN/DATE**

- While the clock digits are flashing, press to set the correct minute.

**M(Month) & D(Date) Digital Indicator**

**Step 4 TIME/CAL**

- When the correct time is displayed and flashing, press once to enter the Setting the Calendar Mode. The Month and Date will begin to flash.

**Step 5 HR/MON**

- Press while the Month and Date digits are still flashing to set the correct month.

**Step 6 MIN/DATE**

- Press to set the correct date.

**Step 7 TIME/CAL**

- After the correct time and date are displayed, press once to exit the Setting Mode.

# Listening to the Radio

## Antenna Information

**FM** - Extend the FM wire antenna to its full length and vary the direction to find it's strongest signal.

**AM** - The AM bar antenna is inside the cabinet. Rotate the cabinet until you find the strongest AM signal.

**NOTE:** If the ON/SLEEP Button is pressed more than **once**, the unit will enter the Sleep Mode. The current time display will have changed to the Sleep Time Indicator (90, 60, 30, 15). Repeatedly press the ON/SLEEP Button until the current time appears on the display.

### ON/SLEEP

Step 1

- Press **once** to turn the power on.

### MODE

Step 2

- Press until the display changes to radio frequency.

### AM/FM

Step 3

- Press to choose AM or FM.

### Step 4 TUNING Up/Down

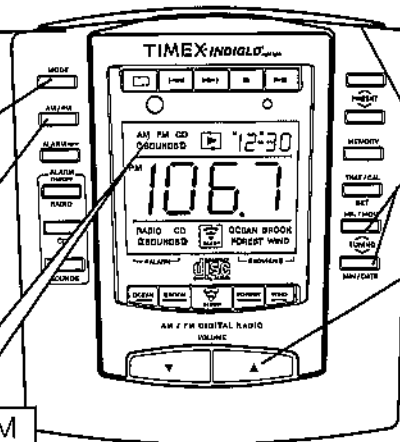
- Press to choose the station you desire.

### Step 5 VOLUME

- Press to adjust the volume

### Step 6 OFF/RESET

- Press to turn the power off.



## Manual Tuning

Repeatedly press the TUNING Up or Down Button to find your desired station.

## Auto Tuning

Press and hold the TUNING Up or Down Button until the radio frequency begins to scan to the next strongest station.

## Last Station Memory

The tuner always remembers the last station selected before the radio was switched OFF and automatically selects the station again when the radio is turned ON.

# Preset Station Memories

This radio has a total of 18 preset station memories (6 AM and 12 FM preset stations). To enter stations in the units memory do the following:

## ON/SLEEP

Step 1

- Press **once** to turn the power on.

## MODE

Step 2

- Press until the display changes to radio frequency.

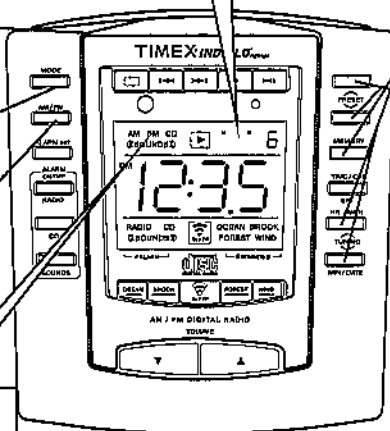
## AM/FM

Step 3

- Press to choose AM or FM.

## Step 4 TUNING Up/Down

- Press to select the station.

## Step 5 MEMORY

- Press MEMORY once while the station is displayed. The radio station digits will begin to flash.

## Step 6 PRESET Up/Down

### SEE NOTE BELOW

- While the digits are flashing, press the Up or Down PRESET Buttons until you find the preset number you want to store the station in.

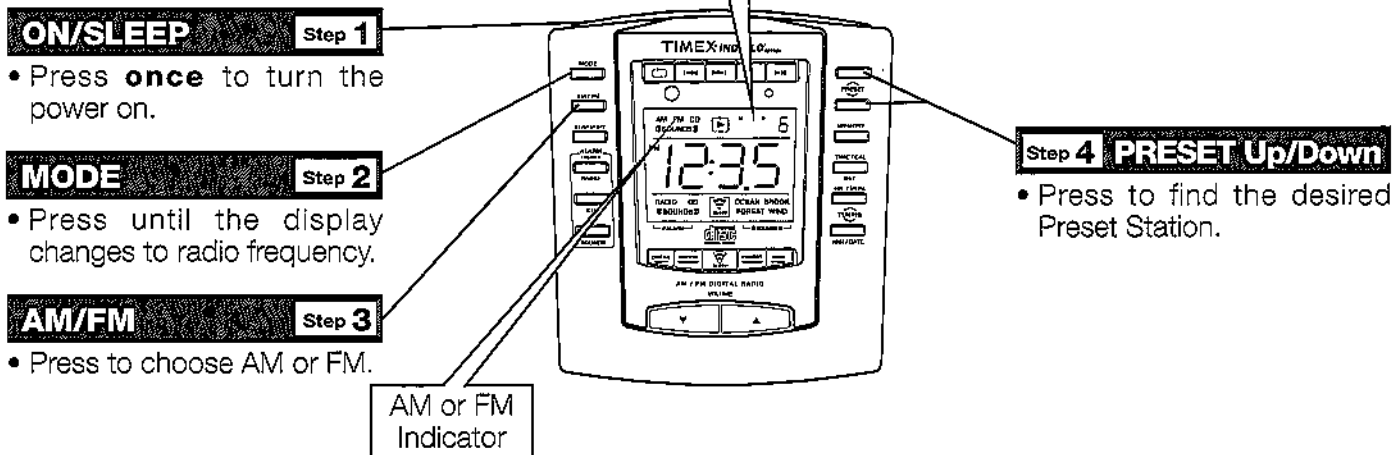
## Step 7 MEMORY

- Press MEMORY again, the station will now be set.

**NOTE:** If you do not press the Preset Buttons in step 6 within 10 seconds the station frequency will stop flashing. Press Memory button twice and proceed to step 6 again.

**To Preset more stations simply follow the instructions above.**

# Recalling Preset Stations



## Changing Preset Stations

To change a Preset Station simply follow the instructions for Preset Station Memories and enter a new station into the preset number you wish to change. The new station will be “remembered” and the previous station will be “forgotten”.

# Playing Compact Discs

## NOTE:

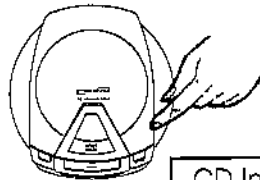
- Do not open the CD door during playback or while the disc is spinning in the pause mode. Always press the Stop Button and wait for the disc to stop before opening the door.

### CD DOOR

Step 1

- Push down gently where it is labeled "PUSH" on the CD player door to open it up, then place a compact disc on the CD spindle with the printed label side facing up. Close the CD player door.

### ON/SLEEP

Step 2

- Press **once** to turn the power on.

### MODE

Step 3

- Press until the CD indicator appears and the date digits change to "00" track digits. The disc will spin momentarily and the track digit number that showed "00" will now show the number of tracks on the disc.

### Step 4 PLAY/PAUSE

- Press to begin the playback. The track digit number will change to 1 and a Play arrow indicator will appear. When the CD advances to the next song, the track digit number will change in order (1,2,3 etc.).

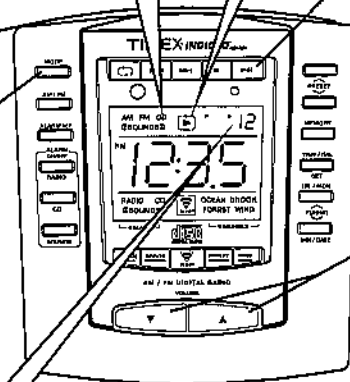
### Step 5 VOLUME Up/Down

- Press to adjust the volume.

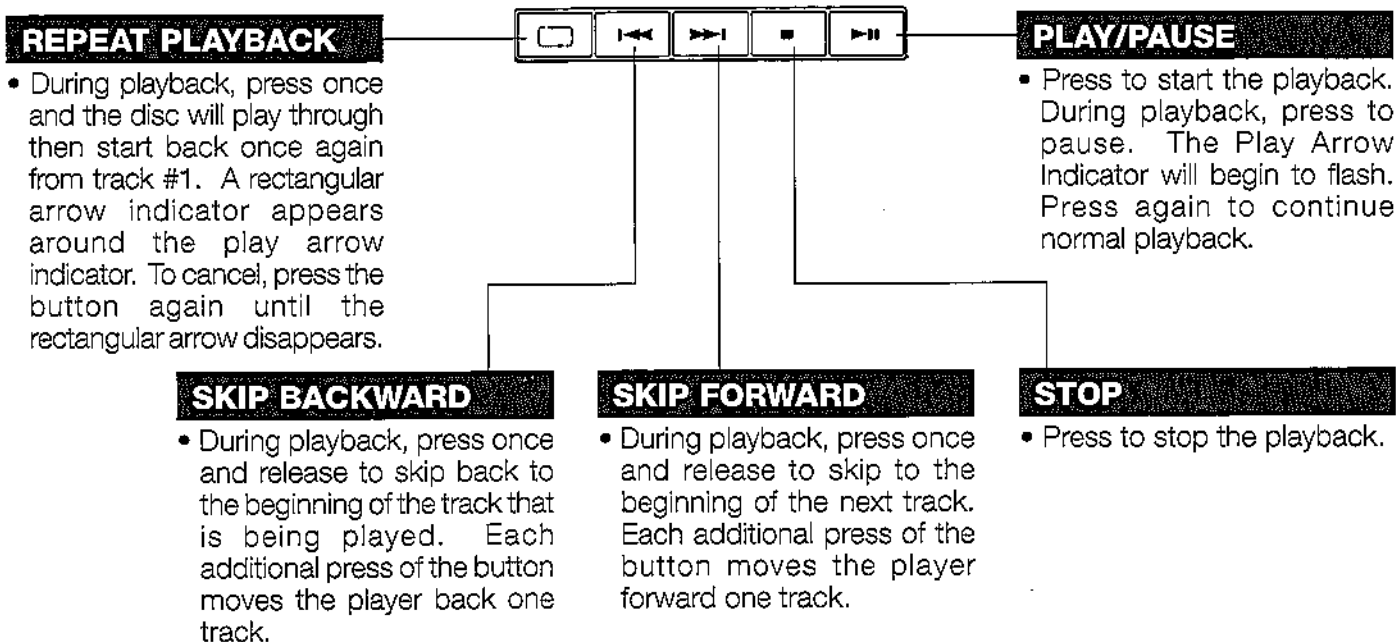
### Step 6 STOP

- Press to stop the playback.

# Playing Compact Discs



## High Speed Music Search

This feature allows you to search forward or backward within a particular track to locate a specific musical passage.

While the disc is playing press and hold the SKIP FORWARD ( **▶▶** ) or SKIP BACKWARD ( **◀◀** ) Button. The player will search rapidly forward or backward as long as the button is held and will resume normal playback when the button is released.

**NOTE:** The volume level is automatically reduced during high speed music search.

# Playing Nature Sounds

## ON/SLEEP Step 1

- Press **once** to turn the power on.

## MODE Step 2

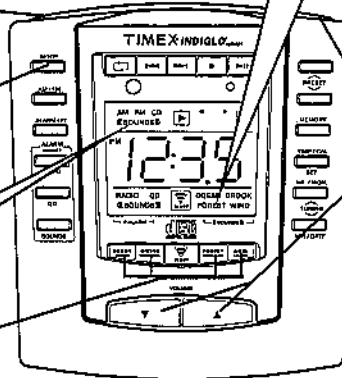
- Press until the «SOUNDS» indicator appears on the display.

## NATURE SOUNDS Step 3

- Press any one of the 4 Nature Sounds. The sound you select will appear on the display.

## Step 4 VOLUME Up/Down

- Press to adjust the volume.

## Step 5 OFF/RESET

- Press to turn the power off.

**NOTE:** *Playing the Nature Sound of your choice will not affect the one that is programmed for wake up time.*

# Setting the Radio Alarm Time

**Before you start please note the following:**

**NOTE:** While setting the alarm times, the display will return to the current clock time if no button is pressed within 10 seconds. You may exit the Setting Mode at anytime by simply pressing the ALARM SET Button repeatedly until the current clock time is displayed.

**NOTE:** Before setting the Radio Alarm Time, you must preset the radio station you wish to wake to into the preset memory. See Preset Station Memories.

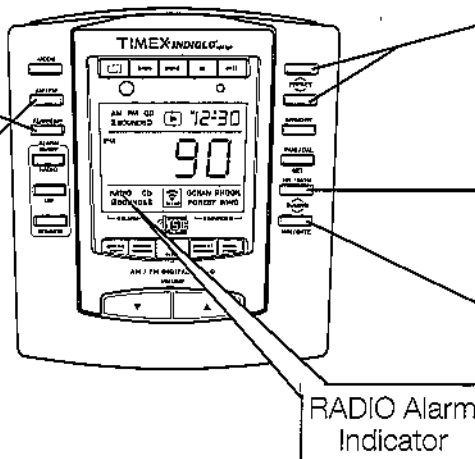
## INDIGLO night-light Operation

### ALARM SET Step 1

- Press until the Radio alarm indicator flashes on the display.

### AM/FM Step 2

- Press to choose AM or FM.



### Step 3 PRESET Up/Down

- Press to select the preset station you desire to wake up to.

### Step 4 HR/MON

- Press to set the alarm Hour.

### Step 5 MIN/DATE

- Press to set the alarm Minute. Then press ALARM SET **three times** to return to the current time display.

### NOTES:

- You can wake to 3 different alarm times by setting different wake up times for the Radio, CD and/or Nature Sounds. To activate all or any of the three alarms, simply press the RADIO, CD or SOUNDS Alarm On/Off buttons.
- To cancel any of the Radio, CD or Nature Sounds Alarm(s) simply press the RADIO, CD or SOUNDS Alarm On/Off Button(s) until the alarm indicator disappears from the lower left hand corner of the display.
- After the Alarm turns on, press the OFF/RESET Button to turn off the Alarm. The Alarm will come on again the following day unless the controls are changed.


### IMPORTANT!!

### Step 6 Alarm on/off Radio

- Press until the "RADIO" alarm Indicator appears on the display to confirm that Wake to Radio is on.

## Setting The CD Alarm Time

**NOTE:** Be sure to insert the CD you wish to wake to. If the alarm is set and there is no CD in the CD player, the alarm will default to Buzzer.

### NOTES:

- You can wake to 3 different alarm times by setting different wake up times for the Radio, CD and/or Nature Sounds. To activate all or any of the three alarms, simply press the RADIO, CD or SOUNDS Alarm On/Off buttons.
- To cancel any of the Radio, CD or Nature Sounds Alarm(s) simply press the RADIO, CD or SOUNDS Alarm On/Off Button(s) until the alarm indicator disappears from the lower left hand corner of the display.
- After the Alarm turns on, press the OFF/RESET Button to turn off the Alarm. The Alarm will come on again the following day unless the controls are changed.

# Setting The Nature Sounds Alarm Time

## ALARM SET

Step 1

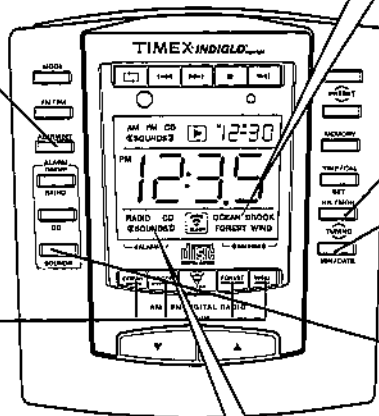
- Press until the «SOUNDS» alarm indicator flashes on the display.

## NATURE SOUNDS

Step 2

- While «SOUNDS» and clock digits are flashing, press Ocean, Brook, Forest or Wind to choose the sound you desire.

Step 3 HR/MON

- Press to set the alarm Hour.

Step 4 MIN/DATE

- Press to set the alarm Minute. Then press ALARM SET **once** to return to the current time display.

## IMPORTANT!!

Step 5 Alarm on/off SOUNDS

- Press until the “ «SOUNDS» ” alarm indicator appears on the display to confirm that Wake to Nature Sounds is on.

## NOTES:

- You can wake to 3 different alarm times by setting different wake up times for the Radio, CD and/or Nature Sounds. To activate all or any of the three alarms, simply press the RADIO, CD or SOUNDS Alarm On/Off buttons.
- To cancel any of the Radio, CD or Nature Sounds Alarm(s) simply press the RADIO, CD or SOUNDS Alarm On/Off Button(s) until the alarm indicator disappears from the lower left hand corner of the display.
- After the Alarm turns on, press the OFF/RESET Button to turn off the Alarm. The Alarm will come on again the following day unless the controls are changed.

## **To Check Your Wake Up Settings**

- Press the ALARM SET Button to change the current clock time to the flashing alarm time display with the flashing alarm indicator in the lower left corner. Repeatedly press the ALARM SET Button until you see the RADIO, CD or «SOUNDS» alarm indicator and the corresponding time on the display.


## **Setting Multiple Alarms**

- You can wake to 3 different alarm times by setting different wake up times for the Radio, CD and/or Nature Sounds. To activate all or any of the three alarms, simply press the RADIO, CD or SOUNDS Alarm On/Off buttons.
- To cancel any of the Radio, CD or Nature Sounds Alarm(s) simply press the RADIO, CD or SOUNDS Alarm On/Off Button(s) until the alarm indicator disappears from the lower left hand corner of the display.

## **Alarm Reset and Snooze Operation**

- After the Alarm turns on press the OFF/RESET Button to turn off the alarm. The Alarm will come on again the following day unless the controls are changed.
- At the selected wake up time(s), if the OFF/RESET Button is not pressed, the Radio, CD and/or Nature Sounds alarm(s) will play for one hour, then stop automatically and reset itself for the following day. The CD will play for 1 hour or as long as the inserted CD plays if less than 1 hour. To stop the alarm play period sooner, press the OFF/RESET Button.
- If you need a few minutes extra sleep when the alarm turns on, press the SNOOZE bar. The alarm will turn off, then come back on again in approximately 10 minutes. You may repeat this cycle several times during the 1 hour time period.

## Sleep to Radio, CD or Nature Sounds

**ON/SLEEP Step 1**

- Press **twice** to enter the Sleep Mode and then press again to choose the sleep time in 90, 60, 30, 15 minute increments. The Sleep Volume Indicator will appear on the display.

**MODE Step 2**

- Press to select the AM, FM CD or Nature Sounds.

**Step 3 SLEEP VOLUME**

- Press to select the Sleep Volume Level. The Sleep Volume will not effect the Wake Up Volume Level.

**NOTE OFF/RESET**

- Press at any time to turn off the Radio, CD or Nature Sounds **before** the sleep time has elapsed.

**NOTE:** If there is no sound while adjusting the Sleep Volume, raise the volume with the main Volume UP Button.

### INDIGLO® night-light Operation

Your unit features an INDIGLO® night-light to assist you in reading the time in a darkened room.

Brightness Control - Adjust the brightness of the clock display, as desired, when the room is darkened.

**NOTE:** When the room is lighted, the Light Sensor shuts off the INDIGLO® night-light to prolong its life.

### Stereo Headphone Jack

Connect a pair of stereo headphones (not included), to the jack for private listening. The built-in speakers are shut off when headphones are connected.

**IMPORTANT:** You must disconnect the headphones from the headphone jack before you go to sleep or you will not hear the built-in speakers when the alarm sounds.
